

Historic Mineral Production in the Greater Coeur d'Alene Mining Region, Idaho

The Coeur d'Alene mining region in northern Idaho produces about 10 percent of our nation's newly mined silver. In 1996, mines produced metals valued at \$53,793,000. Since its beginning in 1884, the region has produced metals valued at \$5,428,091,000.
